

MODERN SLAVERY STATEMENT

This is the modern slavery and human trafficking statement, relating to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015, for SCC Worldwide Ltd.

We oppose slavery and human trafficking in all its forms and make this statement to set out the steps we have taken to ensure that there is no slavery or human trafficking in our business or in our supply chains.

About us

SCC Worldwide Ltd is the trading company of Hamilton Group Holdings. SCC Worldwide Ltd are distributors, designers, suppliers and manufacturers of Audio and Visual Safety Systems including parking and manoeuvring for automotive vehicles and training technicians within car and commercial vehicles dealerships and fleet operators to install such systems.

Not with standing any legal obligation under section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 we are making this statement to show our commitment to ethical trading principles and to set out the steps we are taking to tackle modern slavery and human trafficking in our business and in our supply chains.

Our supply chains are mainly made up of international manufacturers, who take the issues of slavery and human trafficking seriously.

POLICIES

Our Anti-Slavery and Human Trafficking Policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere in our supply chains.

DUE DILIGENCE PROCESSES FOR SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

As part of our initiative to identify and mitigate risk we are committed to putting in place systems to:

- Identify and assess potential risk areas in our supply chains. With any contractors we will look into creating terms which prohibit any form of explorations in order to become trading partners.
- Mitigate the risk of slavery and human trafficking occurring in our supply chains. We will create a policy for obligations on our suppliers to comply with the Modern Slavery Act.
- Monitor potential risk areas in our supply chains. Vetting suppliers and subcontractors to ensure that they are committed to ethical labour practises and include anti-slavery and human trafficking provisions in all our contracts with suppliers.
- Protect whistle blowers.

We have developed and continue to work with charities that specialise in preventing Modern Slavery to develop our knowledge and access and continue to work with charities that specialise in perverting Modern Slavery to develop our knowledge and access to resources for workers.

TRAINING

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our business, we provide training to our staff, as out lined in our Anti Slavery Policy.
